- Presentations at scientific or professional meetings. Please specify whether meetings were local, national or international and whether presentations were oral, poster or workshop. If appropriate please supply an electronic copy of posters/ presentations for the board. Provide in Vancouver style
- Publications: Please state whether you are planning to publish, have a paper in press or have had a paper(s) published relating to your project and in which journal(s). Please provide full citations for any published papers or manuscripts that are in progress (in Vancouver style), along with electronic copies of publications. If you are intending to publish and in the early stages of preparation please provide as much information as possible regarding number of papers and where you aim to publish
 - Please also provide as much information as possible about manuscripts in development (stating an intention to publish is not sufficient) and any prizes, incorporation into educational/ CPD / guidance materials (as citations with succinct accompanying explanations)
